



We write to you at the close of Maryland's 2024 legislative session. Every year, we say the session was a busy one. And, every year, that's true. But this year—with 3,480 bills filed; with more than 280 affecting the System directly; with our people testifying on nearly 50—we were in overdrive.

One of the last bills to pass through the General Assembly—an emergency bill signed by Gov. Moore just hours after sine die—was a bipartisan measure to use rainy day funds to help Port of Baltimore workers affected by the Key Bridge collapse. The PORT Act will support workers not covered by

several areas of need: economic modeling, supply chain management, civil engineering, transportation, water and environmental impact. And should the work stoppage at the port be extended, our universities are prepared to offer education, skills development, and career services to port employees and others who need these opportunities.

It's in times of challenge, especially, that we value the good faith and goodwill of our leaders, united in relief and recovery—united in ensuring that Baltimore and Maryland rebuild, stronger than ever.

We know that Maryland faces a significant deficit. But we know, too, that our elected leaders trust us to do the work that fortifies our strength; the work that fuels Maryland's growth and prosperity. As always, we're excited to do exactly that.

The USM Board of Regents met at Bowie State University on April 19, with public viewing available in-person and via <u>livestream</u>. Highlights from the meeting include:

BSU will offer a new PhD in counselor education and supervision. The university is the first within the USM and the third HBCU in the country to offer this degree.



USMSM hosted an open house allowing participants to explore many different education opportunities available in Southern Maryland.


